SHOOTING SPORTS

ARCHERY practice will start up again in the Fall.

SHOTGUN practice will be April 6th and April 20th at 9:00 am

RIFLE practice will be every Sunday in April from 2-4 pm

STEER TAG IN

Steer tag-in will be April 2nd from 6 - 7 pm in the barn. Exhibitor fee will be \$10 per exhibitor. Junior Livestock committee made a rulebook change in the steer division under #4 - "No pumping of any kind, including drench gun, will be permitted". Make sure to pick up your rulebook on the night of the tag-in.

Major Steer, Heifer, Sheep, and Goat Tags

If you are planning on exhibiting lamb or goat at the State Fair, you must order State Validation Tags. The tags cost \$15.00. Please have your order and payment into the Extension Office on or before April 17th. Please make all checks payable to Calhoun County 4-H Council. For more information, contact the Extension Office.

Please remember that first-time Major Show Exhibitors must be Quality Counts Verified BEFORE they fill out entry forms.

If you are planning on exhibiting a Steer at Major Shows, please contact the extension office by April 17th to order steer tags. Fee \$15 per steer.

If you are going to show a heifer at the Major Shows, please contact the extension office for the number of UIN numbers you will need by April 17th. No charge for UIN numbers.

Purchasing Animal Projects

It is that time of year again to start thinking about animal projects for the 2019 Calhoun County Fair. For first time feeders it can get a little overwhelming and stressful. If you would like assistance with locating or selecting market lambs and goats, or information about your desired project, contact Emilee DeForest at the Extension Office by April 20th. Below is a guideline to the approximate age range you might try to look at when purchasing your animals for the Calhoun County Fair:

Market Hogs: April Born (Approximately 6 months old on show day).

- Hog exihibitors are allow to show 2 hogs this year but can only sell one in the auction
- There will not be a breeding gilt division this year at the livestock show.

Market Lambs: 1st of January - Middle March (8-10 months old on show day).

Market Goats: 1st of January - Middle March (8-10 months old on show day).

- Tag in for Market Hogs, Market Lambs, Market Goats, as well as State Fair Lambs and Goats is on June 26th

Rabbits: Begin communicating with your Breeders in May about your intention to purchase rabbits from them. This gives the breeder adequate time to plan their breeding season and be able to fit your needs. For a list of rabbit breeders in the area, contact the Extension Office. This year there is a change in the Rabbit division #1 - "All rabbits shall be a maximum of 70 days old on day of judging." Please read your rulebook.

- Rabbit Validation and tattoo date is September 10th @ 6 pm in the extension auditorium

Poultry: Families are required to place their Roaster and Broiler orders to the Extension Office. Exihibitors are not responsible for locating their own hatchery. All birds are ordered through Texas A & M University poultry department and picked up on the same date to ensure uniform age.

- Must order Broilers and Roasters by June 13th

GUIDELINES

Does an industry that's been around for 10,000 years have a future for you?

How will you fight against food deserts and world hunger?

Or talk about a topic that interests you, like organic food, robotics on farms, hydroponics, urban farming, data analytics, or the reengineering of seeds.

2. Show us a part of the farming industry.

You could visit a farm or greenhouse near you, head over to your local university and interview an agriculture professor about the industry, or visit a grocery store and ask an employee where they get their food.

- 3. Create a two-minute video that talks about what you learned and shows where you visited.
- 4. Submit your video and get the chance to become an official Farmfluencer.
- 5. Be sure not to use any copyrighted material in your video (if you add music, make sure it's Creative Commons).

JUDGING CRITERIA

- How creative was it? Did it surprise us? Make us laugh? Did you have fun?
- Did it address an aspect of modern agriculture and teach us or show us something new?
